### On the Cover

The Andean Condor is a South American bird with a wide wingspan (up to 10 ft) and long lifespan of 70 years. The male has a wattle on the neck and a red comb on the crown of his head. Unlike most birds, the male is larger than the female. Our Condor pair, Gryphus and Chavin, were hatched in 1979 at the Bronx Zoo and in 1986 at the LA Zoo, respectively.

Andean condors are a vital part of the ecosystem as they help remove dead and decaying animals and in turn, are reducing disease spread.

## From the Desk of the Zoo Director

The summer visitor season is winding down which means the zoo staff is gearing up for the planning and development of next year. The new masterplan has been completed and the zoo has a road map of where we are going in the future. The pathway to that big picture is a bit more convoluted. The zoo

has a very small footprint and all new construction will have ripple effects through the rest of the facility. Both major and minor changes will be occurring as we start moving forward.

The first major change that will be made involves the otter exhibit. This exhibit is old and the filtration system is antiquated and undersized leaving us with water clarity that is not what we would like it to be. Last year the zoo hired a life support consultant who assessed our system and the conclusion was that the cost to retro fit the system to the standard we wanted was too high. Since we have a new otter exhibit in the master plan with exciting interactives and a larger pool size for the otters, we have decided to close down the otter exhibit this fall and move our otter to another facility. Once a new exhibit is built, we will once again bring back this popular species.

The first major exhibit we will undertake with the new master plan is the conversion of the current llama exhibit to a Madagascar exhibit with three species of lemur and radiated tortoises. This project will extend into the current goat yard and we will lose that contact area. We are going to take this opportunity and move the goat contact area into the current otter exhibit footprint. This will allow us to expand our popular contact area, add some new breeds of goats and add climbing structures for them to use. Goats have been domesticated for thousands of years to provide milk, meat and fiber. Having breeds reflecting this will make the exhibit more educational while retaining and enhancing the fun interaction that visitors have enjoyed for years.

We will also be making improvements to our honey bee exhibit to make this area more fun and educational. Pollinators are vital to our survival and we want to emphasize this message while allowing children to have a more interactive experience.

Over the winter we will be working on some other surprises—new species and new exhibit modifications. Be sure to follow the zoo's Facebook page and website to get glimpses of some of the exciting things to expect when you visit next spring.



### What you do:

- 1.) Traveling Zoo: assist zoo staff to take animals to various schools, events, and the local children's hospital.
- 2.) Urban Wildlife Monitoring Program: 4 times a year we place motion-activated trail cameras along a designated line throughout northern Delaware to see what type of wildlife is in the area.
- 3.) DE Kestrel Partnership: to monitor several kestrel nesting boxes throughout the breeding season to see if any kestrels are using them.

### Why you do it:

I started volunteering for the zoo shortly after I gave birth to twins. My background is in conservation biology and environmental education, so it was a way for me to continue working with nature, wildlife, and science on my own schedule. I get to have the best of both worlds: being a full-time mom devoted to my family while still nurturing my own passions and personal growth. I'm so thankful for the amazing opportunities Brandywine Zoo has aiven me!

## Brandywine Zoo Chapter of the American Association of Zoo Keepers Update

This year is flying by and BZAAZK has been busy with guest speakers, fundraisers, and conferences.

To finish off the 2018 year we had 3 wonderful guest speakers:

> Dr. Erica Miller, DVM gave us insight into how birds come in contact with toxic agents, how birds are treated after

exposure, and how it can be avoided in the future.

Dr. Jason Davis, PhD discussed his research combining technology and ecology. Dr. Davis and his students are designing bird feeders and nest boxes with cameras that can, using genetic algorithms and machine learning, differentiate species and sexes of birds. This information can help with bird species counts, migration patterns, and much more.

Leah Newman, an Animal Behavior College certified dog trainer and the Brandywine Zoo's training coordinator, donated her time and knowledge of training to some enthusiastic dogs and their owners. Leah taught us how to use positive reinforcement and operant conditioning to train basic obedience behaviors to our furry best friends!

In August, our Tango PLUS for Tamarins event was a great success. Along with bringing back

food (donated by Trader Joes and

Anthony's Coal Fired Pizza) this year we also introduced country line dancing, lawn games, and a new venue, the Figure-Eight Barn at Bellevue State Park. The event raised over \$1,300 with


