




The Capybara is the largest rodent species, and they are considered semi-aquatic




The North American Porcupine cannot shoot its quills, and if it were to fall from a tree and puncture itself it has antibiotics in its skin that help against infection




Red Pandas are not related to the Giant Panda.

term "ponva" Which means bamboo eater






The toucan's beak appears quite heavy, but is actually light. It is hollow, made of keratin with thin rods of bone to support it - similar in consistency to a hard sponge

The Swift Fox is the smallest member of the dog family, and they have vertical pupils.




Golden Lion Tamarins almost always have twins.




The Andean Condors stomach acid is strong enough to dissolve metal
